Minister's Message:

Back in the year 2009 there was a movie that was very popular and provided an Oscar for actress Sandra Bullock. The title of the movie was *The Blind Side*, referring to the necessity of a football team to protect their most important player, the quarterback. The tackle is the really important player, giving the responsibility to protect the quarterback's blind side. Tragic things can happen when a quarterback is focusing on finding that uncovered receiver, while a defensive lineman is looking forward to creating havoc on the play and taking down the quarterback at the same time. This Sunday we will talk about a person in the New Testament who was blindsided. Saul was traveling on the road to Damascus when he had a strange encounter, an encounter that led him from a life of persecuting Christians to being an outstanding witness for the risen Christ. This is a Sunday School story that we are very familiar with. I remember the Sunday School literature of this story when I was a child. Saul is sprawled on the ground while his horse stands by his side. Later I would study the painting of Michelangelo Carvaggio's painting, The Conversion on The Road to Damascus. There was a horse in that painting as well. However the book of Acts does not mention a horse. But we do know something about Saul who becomes Paul. At this moment in his life he needed to be knocked off his high horse. He needed to dismount from the horse named, I am in control. Or perhaps it was horse named, I am better than anyone around me. This Sunday morning we will talk about the conversion experience of Paul and an individual who made it possible, Ananias. It may just be that at times in life, you and I have the same problems as did Paul. Be with us Sunday as our sermon will be entitled, "The Ministry of Showing Up."
