Minister's Message:

In our description of people we use different phrases. I often hear people say about dependable, hard-working people, and humble people, "They are the salt of the earth." The Rolling Stones group once featured a song entitled, "Salt of the Earth." The lyrics went something like this:

"I wanna drink to the hard working people, let's drink of the lowly of birth, I wanna raise my glass to the good and the evil. Let's drink to the salt of the earth. Say a prayer for our hard fighting soldiers, give some thought to their life-risking work. How about a prayer for their spouses and children they keep the home fires burning and still till the earth."

This week we will be examining some words from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. He makes some suggestions to us. He does not say I want you to think about being the light of the world and the salt of the earth. He does not say you have the potential to be salt of the earth. He doesn't even suggest that with a little more sprucing up, you could become the light of the world. He says rather emphatically, "You are the salt, you are the light. You are to be the city set on a hill. "This week we will consider what these words mean to each of us. We will go back into history and remember an individual who was so important to our Christian history, a man by the name of John Winthrop. Winthrop sailed from England to America in the year 1603 and became the Governor of the Massachusetts Bay Colony. He preached to his people on the way over on the boat Arbella. He talked to them about his dream of building a new society, a city that would be set on a hill for all the world to see. Be with us this Sunday as our sermon will be entitled, "Are You Spendsavour Salt?" Don't forget the potato fest following our service of worship. See you Sunday.
