

Minister's Message:

Several years ago, Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia was being interviewed by a reporter from the New York magazine. The discussion moved to religious topics such as heaven and hell. Scalia then told the reporter, "I especially believe in the devil. In the gospels, the devil is doing all sorts of things. He is possessing people and whatnot." Scalia then stated to the reporter, "You are looking at me as though I am strange. Most of mankind has believed in the devil, for all of history. Many more intelligent people than you or me have believed in the devil." He then asked the interviewer, "Have you read *The Screwtape Letters*?" There are many literary devils, Scalia could have mentioned, those suggested by Dante, or Blake, or John Milton, but instead he named a work by one of the great authors of Christian Apologetics, C.S. Lewis. If you are not acquainted with this work of Lewis, you might want to look it up before Sunday just to get an idea of what the book is about.

This Sunday we will journey with Jesus into the wilderness. There he will encounter the devil, who will place some temptations in front of him. They are ones that we still are faced with this day as well. We all are aware that Jesus remained strong during this time and emerged from the wilderness to begin his ministry, the role of a suffering servant. During our sermon time on Sunday we will ask the question what the devil must have thought when he was unsuccessful in tempting Jesus in the wilderness. Our scripture will be Luke 4: 1-13 and our sermon topic will be "I Got to Him Too Late." We are always cautioned to be aware of where the temptations in our lives may arise. It usually seems that the devil attacks us in our most vulnerable places. May God give us the strength as we begin this Lenten season to be honest with ourselves and the temptations that confront us.
