Green Chalice News You Can Use: Plastic Bags: When you drop off your plastic caps for the Middle School project, please take your plastic bag and plastic zip-lock bags with you to use again. Many people like the "single-use" plastic shopping bags because they can indeed be used multiple times. Once plastic bags have reached the end of their life, they can be recycled at Walmart. Walmart bales and ships this thin plastic to a recycling vendor out of our area. The Fayette Recycling Center in Lexington does not recycle plastic bags. If you put them in your recycling bin, they will end up in a landfill. Paper: The Fayette Recycling Center is still not accepting paper and paperboard (cereal boxes). It does accept dry corrugated cardboard. Randy's Recycling in Cynthiana recycles all forms of paper. They bale the paper and ship to a vendor out of our area. Lexington has yellow bins located about the county for recycling paper. The church is taking our paper to Randy's. Thank you for being good stewards but the local animal shelter is now overwhelmed with newspapers.

Plastic Hangers: Thank you for your participation in the collection of white plastic hangers. When enough are collected, Backyard Ministry will use them for a craft. Hangers can be tubular or flat but need to be totally white and completely plastic. The collection bin is in the Communion Preparation Room. Please do not buy hangers for this project. We want to upcycle existing hangers.



Minister's Message:

This Sunday will be the first Sunday in Lent. We know of this season in the church year and look forward to being a part of it as it draws us closer to specific spiritual practices. This year for our Lenten study we will share in a series to be entitled, "Lent With the Desert Fathers." Each Sunday morning in Lent we will be sharing a particular aspect of the practices of fasting as seen through the lens of the desert tradition. We will be sharing quotes from desert fathers and also examining some practical suggestions for our lives. Historically speaking the desert tradition has its origin in the deserts of Egypt, Palestine and Syria beginning in the late third century and continuing through the late seventh century. The sayings of the desert fathers are usually short statements or stories that take the form of an elder giving spiritual counsel or advice to his or her disciple. The elders' words continue to be spoken and have relevancy in our society of today. In our Lenten season we must recognize that the desert is not so much for us a place as it is an experience. The geography is an interior one, an empty, barren landscape, where there is no place to hide. It is there where we must surrender to God and learn how to be drawn closer to him in this time of study. Our series will provide us with the following topics:
