

Minister's Message:

This Sunday will be the second one of Lent as we continue our thoughts in our Lenten series entitled "Lent With the Desert Fathers." The scripture will be John 3: 1-17 and the sermon will be entitled, "Celebrate Theological Modesty." This week's quote from the desert fathers is from St. John Chrysostom, "We do not know wholly even what is given in part, but only know a part of a part." The main person of interest in the scriptural lesson on Sunday will be Nicodemus, a man of the law. He was a Pharisee, not only a lawyer, but also a person whose sole purpose was to make observations of intricate regulations governing all behavior, thought, and speech. The people of his time sought God in ritual perfection. Jesus comes and suddenly the game is changed. He is not preaching the law, but love. He is introducing a God who does not keep score. He is a forgiving God and not a God of retribution. This is not necessarily good news for Nicodemus who thinks that the game is indeed changing and hears individuals need to be born again. This does not make sense to him, so he struggles. We do not know it all, we have to be open to new ideas and concepts. This Sunday morning we will examine some of the problems that Nicodemus encountered in his nighttime conversation with Jesus. We likewise in this time of Lent need to be able to examine some of our old beliefs in order to perhaps receive new ones that are more Christ-like. When we gather in the wilderness with Jesus, we realize he has changed the game and we must keep up with the rules.
