

# Minister's Message:

This Sunday we will continue to journey to Jerusalem as a part of our present sermon series, talking about the area of Perea. This is where Jesus spent a great deal of time before he entered Jerusalem. The scripture lesson for the message will be Luke 13: 31-35. It is within this scripture that Jesus has a conversation with the Pharisees. His relationship with them was rather contentious. The problem seemed to be that Jesus did not sugarcoat anything for anyone. He was challenged to do what some people refer to as "make it plain" in his words and actions. In this chapter Jesus is removing all doubt about some people's behaviors. In essence he is "telling it like it is." Even though the Pharisees have a problem with Jesus and his teachings, on this occasion they seem to come to his aid. They say to him, "Get away from here for Herod wants to kill you." Their warnings are not enough for Jesus. He tells them that what is important to him is casting out demons and performing cures, not only today but tomorrow. Jesus is not going to back down from any danger, including the danger from King Herod. There are times in our lives when we are limited by our fears. We may even receive some warning to let go, to break loose, or to do things in a different way. In this season of Lent we are challenged to stay focused. Life presents to each one of us some challenging obstacles, obstacles that might defer us or rush us. My wonderful grandchildren will tell you that I always encourage them in their activities "to visualize." They are extremely patient with me as they have heard this so many times, but they still listen without question. Jesus encourages us to keep our sights on what is ahead of us, to finish what we start and never be distracted. That is the way Jesus made it all the way to Jerusalem.
