Green Chalice News You Can Use: This year we extend to you another challenge: commit to one new act of stewardship.... just one thing. Many environmental groups are dedicating 2018 to ending plastic pollution. Since the 1950s, 9 billion tons of plastic has been produced. Plastic is marvelous and has aided countless aspects of our lives; but every piece of plastic that was ever made still exists in some shape or form. Unlike paper that biodegrades to useful nutrients, plastic disintegrates or erodes into smaller and smaller fragments. Once it reaches the size of a grain of rice, it is considered a micoplastic. The Great Pacific Ocean Garbage Patch, twice the size of Texas, is composed primarily of floating plastic. It actually isn't a raft of plastic that you can walk across. It is an area of micoplastics. Most data on plastic is from study of the oceans but don't think that gets landlocked Kentuckians off the hook. Plastic pollution is also in our river systems. Microplastics have been found in 83% of tap water samples from major cities around the world and in 93% of samples from the world's top 11 bottled water brands. We challenge you to choose one type of plastic and Reduce, Refuse, Recycle and Remove it from the environment. Congratulations to the youth: we understand that many Refused a straw at their Sunday lunch gathering at the Mexican restaurant. God's rivers and oceans thank you as we do.

# Minister's Message:

I take this moment to extend a note of thanks to many of you for comments regarding Sunday's worship service. Our Green Chalice Committee and choir were also instrumental in your pleasure. Many of you expressed joy at having a guest present, Mr. Louie Armstrong with his singing of *It's a Wonderful World*. Kathy asked me as to what song we were going to play this week and I told her we would probably just skip a special number from the back. I then starting working on my sermon and it is one that deals with the conversion of the Ethiopian eunuch. When you and I think about conversion, we usually think of revivals. The only song I know of that speaks of revivals is the old one by Ray Stephens. You remember that one, don't you? It was entitled the *Mississippi Squirrel Revival* and tells about the squirrel that got loose in the First Self-Righteous Church in Pascagoula. It was quite an exciting morning. I believe the song suggests that over \$25,000.00 dollars was raised for missions and seven of the deacons plus the preacher got saved. I don't think we will play that on Sunday morning but it is an excellent point of reference.

The scripture lesson for our morning's reading is Acts 8: 26-40 and the sermon will be entitled "The Deacon Who Was Converted." It is the story of the conversion of the queen's servant, but it is also the conversion of the evangelist Philip. There were many thoughts and values that Philip had to change before he was able to bring this particular person to Christ. I guess you can say that he was a religious product of his environment, and that was not one that God wanted him to demonstrate. So he had to make some changes in how he approached this subject of evangelism. We might just discover on Sunday that we also have some attitude changes to make. We may find ourselves proclaiming to be religious but being rather selective in how inclusive we find both our words and actions. Again I appreciate your remarks and notes regarding our worship together last Sunday. I must share with you my level of excitement for our time together this week. I always find it exciting to see something different about a scripture that I have read dozens of times. I am looking forward to sharing with you these new thoughts about deacon Philip. .....Larry
