Minister's Message:

I appreciate what Jonathan Conner, Lutheran minister in Manning, Iowa, had to say about upcoming Mother's Day. He suggested that his mother like our mothers taught us many Godly virtues during his childhood. These are lessons that stay with us even till this day. There is no way we can ever repay them for what they have given to us. Here are some of the lessons that Conner suggests his mother taught him:

“She taught me how to pray. I can still hear her saying, you better pray that comes out of the carpet. She instilled a sense of imagination in me, don't do that again or else...or else what? She taught me how to anticipate, just you wait until your father comes home. She taught me how to count...at least to three, one, two, three. She taught me repentance, don't you ever do that again. And she taught me self-control, don't touch anything and then she'd often combine self-control with imagination, or else...”
