

Minister's Message:

What a great worship service this past Sunday, our Blessing of Children service, the recognition of all the ladies of the church, and the Men's Chorus. That does not include the large attendance we had. Would it not be wonderful to have the church packed every Sunday morning? We know we can. It may have to do with our power of witnessing.

It was Woody Allen who once said that fifty percent of life is simply showing up. I think he is correct. This Sunday we will talk about the New Testament figure Matthias. When the disciples were attempting to address the problem of who was to take the place of the departed disciple Judas, they did not talk about someone who was well-spoken, highly educated, or the possessor of people skills. They chose Matthias because during the ministry of Jesus Christ on this earth, he was always around, he always showed up.

I would like for us to highlight our ministry of doing the same, showing up to witness, to nurture, and to display compassion and concern.
