

Minister's Message:

When we returned home to Pulaski, Virginia for mom's service and interment, I saw some of my high school classmates. One was a fellow football player while the other was the captain of the cheerleading squad. I don't remember a lot concerning my high school football years, but I do remember that Judy and her fellow cheerleaders were always encouraging. That helps if you only secure four wins in two seasons. I might add that three of those wins in my junior year had to be forfeited because our star halfback was married to one of the cheerleaders, which was against high school athletic policy at that time. Oh well, four wins, sixteen loses, makes a man out of you. I remember some of those cheers, "Two bits, four bits, six bits a dollar, all for the Orioles, stand up and holler." In all honesty there was little to get excited about. I also remember the back and forth cheer with the other team's fans and cheerleaders, "We've got spirit, how about you?" Then the other side would respond, "We've got spirit, yes we do. We've got spirit, how about you?" You always hoped for the louder fans.
