

Minister's Message:

Recently on a trip with a friend to Virginia, we visited a place where I had not been for some forty five years, Camp Powhatan. I spent summers there both as a camper and a staff person, a chaplain. I cannot tell you the feelings I experienced as I returned to this place that holds so many pleasant memories for me. I saw the exact area of the creek where I got my dad's station wagon stuck when we tried to cross the creek where the water was low. This was because one of the bridges to camp was out but they had just stocked the camp ponds with trout, we could not let a minor obstacle get in our way. Talk about major obstacle, calling dad to help get us out. Or what about the time we were dressed up like Indians for the special ceremony, doing Indian dances when that German Shepherd got loose from someone and chased us to the beat of the drums. I remember the time the scouts in a troop put the biggest bull frog I have even seen in their scoutmaster's sleeping bag. He was also a minister. But as he exited his tent after crawling in his sleeping bag, he struck a tree that almost knocked him out. His language at that moment was not reflective of his religious faith. I remember a scout telling my dad that he had seen a rattlesnake go under his tent platform. Dad insisted we pick it up to check on the reptile. When dad reached down to pick up the platform, one of his scouts reached from behind and pinched him on the back of the leg. It was a bad move for the young tenderfoot scout. It was a special afternoon at a sacred spot for me. I remember this feeling at other times in my life. The locations were different, Valley Forge, Gettysburg, Arlington, and the Vietnam Memorial Wall. What made these spaces so special were the sacrifices made by so many, sacrifices for our behalf. We need to honor and remember them continually. You have your own sacred places. Cherish them and appreciate those who made them so special.
