Minister's Message:

Folks, our Bish is in church camp again, this week! How many years and children has he ministered to in this special way? How many of you were guided by Bish in the ways of the Lord at church camp? And he does this lovingly on our behalf; showing the Lord's path as an alternative to the wide highways of the world which so often lead to personal destruction.

In this time of such horrible tragedies and dangers for our youth, do you realize how important you and your church's youth ministries are...the youth group gatherings on Wednesdays, the Friday before-school prayer breakfasts, the Sunday afternoon youth meetings, the Sunday School classes, the Vacation Bible Schools, the special youth Sundays, the children's hand bells and choirs and CHURCH CAMP. How they can help every child who participates regularly choose the Christian values and practices which help them resist the temptations of life. How regularly joining with other Christian youth can give every child godly examples and assurance that they are not alone when walking God's path. How they can discover the powerful hope which will help them turn their failures and fearful experiences into victories. These are YOUR ministries, Folks, as we collectively provide them, pray for them, support them, volunteer to help with them and KEEP OUR CHILDREN, GRANDCHILDREN AND NEIGHBORS' CHILDREN INVOLVED REGULARLY.
