Minister's Message:

The Inca Indians in Peru were the first to cultivate potatoes around 8,000 BC to 5,000 BC. History tells us that they used potatoes for other purposes than dinner. They placed raw slices on broken bones to promote healing. They also carried them to prevent rheumatism. They treated facial blemishes by washing one's face daily with potato juice. It was a practice for the Incas to treat frostbite or sunburn by applying raw grated potato or potato juice to the affected area. They also believed you could help a toothache by carrying a potato in your pocket. What about a sore throat? You could assist that condition by putting a slice of baked potato in a stocking and tying it around your throat. One could also ease aches and pains by rubbing the affected area with the water potatoes have been boiled in.

It seems that planting potatoes is very similar to God's kingdom. You do the planting, but you can't see until harvest time comes. You plant your potatoes in raised beds, loose soil. With other vegetables you can see what is coming on, there is something visible to the eye. With potatoes you have to wait until harvest to see if anything is there. This Sunday we will talk about some gardening activities, especially as they relate to the subject of the potato. All of us are in need of this gift of patience. We daily sow seeds with those around us. We hope and pray that our seeds of kindness, compassion, and joy will come to harvest. We certainly are aware that we live in a world that could benefit from the growth of such virtues.
