One of the sights Anna, Jordon, Andrea and I visited in Chicago was Wrigley Field. The Cubs were not in town but a game sponsored by Under Armor of high school All-Americans took place on Saturday evening. It was just enjoyable to visit the famous stadium where some of my baseball favorites played, Ernie Banks, Ryan Sandburg, Mark Grace and Ron Santo. As I sat there behind home plate I took a look down the left field line and recalled a fan by the name of Steve Bartman. I could not believe that I read an article yesterday about this same person. On October 14, 2003 a Cubs fan innocently reached over the rail to attempt to catch a foul ball. This was the 2003 National League Championship Series. The Cubs were ahead 3-0 in the top of the eighth inning, needing only five more outs to make it to the World Series for the first time in 58 years. The Cub's right fielder Moises Alou raced over to the stands to that foul ball mentioned earlier, but before he could catch it Steve Bartman reached for the ball himself and got in Alou's way. Instead of an out, it was merely a foul ball. Fans around him were enraged, so much so he had to be escorted from his seat by security personnel and then out of the park.

Fourteen year after his fiasco, looked upon as a goat to the Cub's baseball tradition, a gesture was made possible by the team's 2016 World Series Championship. On Monday Steve Bartman was called into the office of team president, Thomas S. Ricketts and was presented with a World Series ring of his own. As one Cub supporter said, "Cub's fans have been waiting for a moment like this. Just to put
