

I enjoy taking in the different events and cheering on our athletes, but what I really appreciate are the story lines behind these individuals. These are very inspirational stories from the lives of all athletes from the many countries participating. I came across a very interesting article the other day in **Christianity Today** entitled, "Meet the Rio Athletes Who Put God Before Gold." It was an inspiration to read this article and to listen to these athletes talk about their faith. I will share a couple of stories with you. Swimmer Maya DiRado who has done well in the Olympics, states that she doesn't think God really cares about her swimming very much, but he does care about whether she is bringing his love and mercy into the world. Fellow swimmer Simone Manuel, who won a gold medal this week, remarks, "All glory to God. Isn't he awesome?" Jake Dalton is a member of the men's gymnastics team. After he made the Olympic team in 2012 he had this message from Philippians 4:13 placed on his side, "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." Gabby Douglas has also expressed strong religious beliefs. "I always pray at every competition, when the judge's hand goes up I am praying, short prayers like, I can do all things through Christ, don't fear, be courageous." First-time Olympian gymnast Laurie Hernandez says she also turns to prayer to assist with the pressure, "prayer seems to ground me, I am then able to think clearly and able to calm down." The list could go on and on. In our lives we also realize the importance of our faith, in times of joy and times of defeat, tears of happiness and tears of pain.
