Minister's Message:

This Sunday morning as a part of our worship service, we will be introduced to one of the Saints of the early church, Gregory the Great. Gregory was consecrated Pope on the third of September 590, so the first of September is when individuals commemorate his life. The most famous story of Gregory involves his visit to the slave market of his city. There he sees slaves being put up for sale. They are from Britain, far from the Roman Empire. Gregory asks of their race and is told that are Angles, which in due course combined with the Saxons and others to create the English race. But according to tradition, Gregory looked at them and said, "Non Angli Sed Angeli." His statement will serve as our sermon topic this Sunday morning, "Non Angli Sed Angeli," not angles but angels. The scripture for this Sunday's message is taken from the Gospel of Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23. This passage from Mark stresses that the pure in heart are those who are spiritually pure rather than ritually or ceremonially clean.

The people of the time of Jesus are so concerned about rituals that they forget about basic needs. St. Gregory saw what others had been missing. Sounds pretty contemporary, does it not? Clean hands are not enough, we must also do some examinations of our hearts. The pure in heart are those who are spiritually pure. Cleanliness may be next to godliness but it is a rather poor substitute.

Before we gather here on Sunday maybe we can monitor our words and actions on a daily basis. Do we view the sacred aspect of the lives around us? What do people hear from us? St. Gregory arranges for some of the British slaves to be released, they are then trained in the church and go back to evangelize the British Isles. That is why today we still refer to Saint Gregory as "The Apostle of the English." Hope to see you Sunday morning and also Sunday night at the park for our karaoke night sponsored by the Outreach Committee.
