

Minister's Message:

This Saturday the Kentucky Wildcats will try to beat the University of Florida in football, something they have not been able to accomplish for years upon years. Through the years I appreciated the Florida Gators for only one reason, Loren Broadus. Loren was one of my favorite professors at Lexington Theological Seminary. I was deeply saddened to read that he passed away in his home state of Florida last week. Dr. Broadus started at L.T.S. in 1968, the same year I did, and remained there until 1995. He and his wife, Katherine were a lovely couple in ministry and even co-authored several books, one a classic entitled Laughing and Crying with Little League. When Loren and Katherine would go away on trips to promote their books or ventures, they would always ask Anna and I if we could stay at their house and watch their three boys, Mark, Barry, and Philip. I was drawn very close to Dr. Broadus in my seminary days, perhaps because he was a star athlete in track and football at the University of Florida. He was a captain for the Gators his senior year. Loren also wrote another excellent book entitled, How To Stop Procrastinating and Start Living. It is an excellent work and has so much advice that you and I need to hear today. I will always remember the life of Loren Broadus, a man who taught me much about ministry, but even more about life. He made the most of each day and appreciated every relationship. He never was ever too busy to listen to the woes of a first year seminary student. He always gave you his undivided attention and the gift of his time. He always made you feel welcome. This Sunday we will talk about the element of time and how sometimes we don't appreciate the interruptions that come our way. The sermon will be entitled, "Pardon the Interruptions." I challenge you this week and those to come to slow down and see the relationships around you and the opportunities that may come your way. Interruptions are very valuable to all of us.
