

Minister's Message:

This Sunday our sermon thoughts will be taken from Jeremiah 8:18-9:1. As we all remember Jeremiah is often referred to as the weeping prophet. Jeremiah is in a state of depression because his people are hurting, they are suffering from specific wounds. He challenges them to stop pretending that nothing is wrong, to stop turning away from the suffering, and finally to listen to the voices of the wounded and oppressed. He was also very confrontational to the religious leaders of the day and time. He suggests to them that they stop proclaiming they have the magic words or special liturgies to correct the situation. Jeremiah is very specific with some of his questions. Do we not have resources to deal with this dilemma? Don't we have medicine? Why do we keep suffering with the same affliction? Jeremiah feels powerless and seeks God's wisdom for his people.

We would be correct if we stated that there are many cries in the world in which we live today. Our nation is shaken from shockwaves of violence, intolerance, anger, suspicion and fear. Anathea Portier-Young of Christianity Today writes, "At this moment our whole country is a powder keg, about to ignite, fueled by long legacies of religious intolerance. Today there is a grief for the nation. Jeremiah weeps for the people. God weeps for the people. If you, like Jeremiah, like God, are moved to tears by this people's pain, take a breath, and deep testifying." This Sunday morning we will suggest together that there is a balm in Gilead. Jeremiah reminds us that life is not about sitting around waiting for our medicine. Band-aids and half measures will not bring us to the cure we desire. The hymn we sing, "There is a Balm in Gilead," was a favorite of slaves that made the voyage across the Atlantic. They knew the truth, God does not abandon us. With Jeremiah we can lament, look out the window and see the world, but still keep our hope. Our sermon will be entitled, "Jeremiah, the Weeping Prophet."
