Minister's Message:

Sunday was a very meaningful one. The choir anthem, Marilynn and Pam's piano-organ duet, the children's handbells, and Brad's children sermon all contributed to a memorable day. Thanks to Charla Nunnelley for assisting with our World Communion celebration. We were so proud we had stored the flags of the different nations in an easy spot to remember. It was during the children's sermon when our youngsters were placing flags in the symbolic world bread that I almost lost it. Brad would have the children announce their country's flag and place it in the bread. He had to help the smaller ones, but the larger ones were doing extremely well. Then one of our favorite little fellows announced his country as being not South Korea but South Carolina. A spontaneous chuckle came forth from all.

Last time I checked I don't think South Korea and South Carolina are very close, at least in terms of distance. This Sunday we will share a story about an Old Testament warrior by the name of Naaman. The scripture you need to read is II Kings 5: 1-14. In his attempt to be healed, Naaman in my calculation made five mistakes, thus our sermon title for Sunday will be "Five Serious Mistakes." Naaman could not grasp the simple advice given to him by the prophet, he tried to make it way too complicated. We will talk about Naaman's mistakes on Sunday. We need to do so because you and I are still making the same mistakes in our lives today. When it comes to matters of healing, oftentimes are pride gets in the way. We try to make the process into a big production, instead of making it simple as God intends for it to be. Could it be that you and I need to practice a little more of the spirit of humility? There is no reason for us to be so far away from what we need to be brought back to, wholeness. Whether in South Korea or South Carolina, we can count on our flag of faith being recognized by a healing God.
