

I just completed reading a newspaper article that is difficult to believe. However, when I think about the society in which we live I guess it should not be too surprising. It seems that a man in Tampa, Florida was arrested for D.U.I. Much to our dismay we know this is a fact about life that happens too frequently. I have to admit the gentleman caught had a great imagination. When taken to the police station after failing sobriety tests, he came forth with the shocker. He had not being driving his vehicle. The car had been driven by man's best friend, his dog. Maybe he was driving because of his owner's high levels of alcohol and marijuana use. Over the years we have heard of explaining one's lack of homework with the excuse, "The dog ate it." But this is taking it way, way too far. This Sunday our sermon will be from the scripture Mark 10: 46-52 with the sermon being entitled, "Bartimaeus and Zacchaeus." It is the story of a blind man, Bartimaeus.
