**Minister's Message:**

When I was growing up I was a New York Yankee fan. During the summer I spent hours on my grandparent's farm. In the side yard, I spent hours throwing rubber balls against a huge chimney. I was Mickey Mantle, Roger Maris and Yogi Berra. I robbed many people of home runs as I went against the fence in Granny's side yard. Then I was a Braves fan when they had a minor league team in Pulaski, Virginia. My dad took me to as many games as I wanted to go to. I was then Joe Adcock, Johnny Logan, and Warren Spahn. Then my uncle George took me to the hardware store one day and bought my Johnny Temple glove, thus changing my allegiance to the Reds. I did not know at the time that I would have the chance to live close to Cincinnati and see the Big Red Machine. In those years to follow I was able to view the skills of Pete Rose, Johnny Bench, Tony Perez and my favorite little Joe Morgan.

Joe Morgan the best second baseman in the post Jackie Robinson era, died Sunday at his California home, at the age of 77. I could tell you about all of his baseball accolades, five-time gold glove, World Series hero, and many more accomplishments. But I choose to tell you about Joe Morgan and his daughter Angela. In 2015 Morgan learned he had a form of cancer that would leave him predisposed to Leukemia.. His condition was serious enough that he needed a bone marrow transplant. Many years earlier, Angela Morgan, her name at the time, had placed her name on the National Donor Registry. She had forgotten she had volunteered to help someone in need. One day she was called upon to do so. She worried about her father's condition and wondered if his donor would be located. To make a long story short, Angela discovered she was a match for her dad. Due to her gift to her dad, he received four more years to be with her and his family.

We might not know it, but we have many gifts to share with those around us. We can share with others the gifts of love and joy, patience and peace, affirmation and acceptance, hope and optimism. We should not be waiting any longer. Look around you and see members of your family, your family of friends, and those you do not even know and be a life-giver.
