

Minister's Message:

The Nationals are one game away from winning the National League Championship Series. They have defeated the St. Louis Cardinals three straight games. Gerardo Parra has been a top player in the series. His walk-up song in honor of his 2 year-old daughter is "Baby Shark." There is even a baby shark that resides in the dugout of the Nationals for every game. Players oftentimes give "Baby Shark" hand signals to teammates. The song which is loved by our granddaughter Blake mentions, baby shark, mommy shark, daddy shark, grandma shark and grandpa shark. Not to mention verses such as "Let's go hunt do do do. Run away do do do do. Safe at last do do do do. Or it's the end do do do do." I am telling you that song can wear you down, over and over and over again. You also can make up your own verse like "Bishie shark do do do do." It looks like the Nationals and all those baby sharks are headed to the World Series.

We will have a scripture lesson this week in which a widow encounters a judge. She is persistent to the point of being obnoxious in seeking the justice she believes is due. You will find the story in Luke 18: 1-8. Jesus is sharing with his followers a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. In our religious lives, there are times when we have to be persistent. We must not give up easily. Even if it means that we keep doing the same thing over and over again. Wilbur and Orville Wright were reprimanded in high school for never paying attention in class. This was because they were so distracted by a machine, a machine heavier than air, that could actually fly. They were determined in their efforts. Jesus is suggesting in this parable that we never throw in the towel. Be with us on Sunday as our sermon will be entitled, "Prayers From Mother Teresa."
