BRINGING IN THE WREATHS



Minister's Message:

This Sunday's sermon is taken from Mark 10:46-52, the healing of the blind man Bartimaeus. It will be entitled, "It's Time to Shed the Cloak." As I worked on this sermon yesterday, I thought about many musicians who were also blind. They all became very famous because they had faith in themselves and in a higher being to overcome this difficulty. I guess you would have to say that Ray Charles and Stevie Wonder would be ranked at the top, one and two. You could not lose in placing either one of them as best ever. Other notable musical persons with seeing problems would include, county-western singer, Ronnie Milsap, Puerto Rican guitarist Jose Feliciano, and one more. The one more would be Anna's favorite performer, Andrea Bocelli. All of these individuals could be deserving of our highest accolades.

We might also give a note of praise to Bartimaeus as well. He not only had a physical problem, but he was also identified as a beggar. I want to explore another idea with you on Sunday morning. In his painting named, "Christ Healing the Blind," Domenico Fiaselia has given Bartimaeus a sort of occupation, one that would have been familiar in his day and time, a musician. He pictures the blind beggar as a violist, hanging the instrument from the belt of his tunic. It is a beautiful painting and we will share some more thoughts on it during our worship time together on Sunday. Bartimaeus is a person encountered by Jesus that is to be remembered fondly by each of us. He was a person of faith, a person who made the most of the opportunities that came his way, and a person who stood up even in the midst of adversity. More importantly he was a person who placed his eyes upon Jesus and followed him with his life. May we strive to do likewise.
