If you are electronically challenged, give your store receipts to your favorite schoolteacher or place your receipts in the Box Top bin in the Communion Preparation Room. Minister's Message:

Author Kurt Vonnegut was a funny, irreverent, an "unbelieving believer, he called himself. His classic novel Slaughterhouse Five was written out of his experience as a POW in World War II. He was incarcerated in a slaughterhouse five stories beneath street level during the bombing of Dresden. After his escape as a result of the bombings, his writings had a deep appreciation of human life and the uniqueness of every person. Vonnegut also spent much of his time addressing college audiences. On one occasion while speaking to the students of the University of Wisconsin, he told the audience about his uncle Alex. His uncle was a graduate of Harvard who had a vocation of being an insurance salesman in Indianapolis. He was well-read and very wise. His main complaint against other human beings was that they seldom noticed when they were happy. He summarized: "When you are drinking lemonade under an apple tree in the summer, say, and talking lazily about this and that, almost buzzing like honeybees you need to remember what surrounds you." Vonnegut then told the students that his uncle would go on to explain in this manner, "If this isn't nice, I don't know what is." Youth Sunday and All Saints Day was indeed extremely remarkable and inspiring. If it was not special, I don't know what is. Brad and his youth combined the elements of All Saints Day and Camp Wakon'Da Ho to provide as meaningful a worship service as I can ever remember. His leadership along with several adult helpers plus these fine outstanding young people in the church should be the recipients of our greatest accolades. It was a very happy day and I am sure we will cherish it in our memories for a long time. Maybe this week we can keep the spirit of Sunday going. May happiness be with you this week and the weeks leading up to Thanksgiving. What a wonderful congregation of people of all ages supporting one another. "If this isn't nice, I don't know what is."
