Minister's Message:

The term "humble pie" has some interesting roots. In the 14th century, the numbles was the name given to the heart, liver, and entrails of animals, especially of deer. By the 15th century, this word "numbles" had become "umbles." Umbles were used as an ingredient in pies and the first "umble" pie appeared in the late 17th century. Umbles derives from Latin and old French words meaning "loins." Humble pie means of lowly rank, or having a low estimate of oneself. Umble pies were known to be eaten often by those in a humble situation. Thus we get the name "humble pie." This Sunday our sermon will have to do with this subject of humility. You will find the scripture lesson in Deuteronomy 8. Humility implies that a person who possesses this virtue is one that has his or her feet on the ground. These people are levelheaded and truthful, and are not the center of their own universe. Rather such people focus their attention on God and on others. Jesus reminded his disciples about this gift. The followers of Jesus are to take the lowest place and leave the seats of honor to others. After his epic saga *Roots* was published in 1976, Alex Haley said that in his office he had a picture of a turtle sitting on a fencepost. When he looked at it, he was reminded of a lesson taught to him by a friend John Gaines. "If you see a turtle on top of a fencepost, you know he had some help." Said Haley, "Anytime I start thinking, wow, isn't this marvelous what I've done, I look at that picture and remember how this turtle. . me. . got up on that post! " I hope you will be here with us this Sunday as we talk some more about this turtle. Our sermon will be entitled "There Was Someone Before Me." Speaking of Sunday messages, an enormous thanks to Brad, Pam and Lindsay for their work with our youngsters for All Saints Sunday. Their efforts were simply outstanding and inspiring. All parents, grandparents, and members of the congregation should feel proud.
