Heritage News: The limestone building housing our beautiful sanctuary is actually the third church building at the corner of Main and Mill. It was dedicated on June 16, 1901. The total cost of the structure was \$37,041.21, including the stunning stained glass windows. According to *A Souvenir History of The Christian Church of Cynthiana, Ky* (1901), the gifts of the memorial windows totaled \$1,183 and the remaining "leaded glass windows" cost \$440. Astute observers will notice that certain stained glass panels are visible only from the interior of the church and others are visible only from the exterior, unless you crawl through some locked areas of the building. **Trivia Question: How many stained glass windows are in the 1901 church building?** You won't find the answer in the history book but you can read about the memorials beginning on page 177. The church library has a few copies of the *Souvenir History* for your enjoyment.



Minister's Message:

In our worship service weekly we not only take communion, we also sing the doxology. I started singing the doxology at age five, long before church nurseries, when children sat, wiggled, struggled and suffered through worship. Even if I missed a few Sundays a year or did not attend as much as I should have in college, I've probably sung the doxology something like 3,500 times. I am sure you are interested in this useless information. But what is not useless is what the words of the doxology suggest to us. My favorite doxology story involves Dodger pitcher Orel Hersheiser, nicknamed "Bulldog" for his fierce competitiveness. But he also exhibited a spirit of calmness in tense situations. After being named the most valuable player in the 1988 World Series, he appeared on the Johnny Carson show. He was asked how he stayed so calm on the mound. His answer stunned the host. "I sing a hymn. I sing that hymn we sing every Sunday in church." Carson asked him to sing it for the audience, and he did. And what did he sing," Praise God from whom all blessings flow," the doxology.

Please be present with us on Sunday morning for our service of worship. We will talk some more about our true blessings in life. "Praise God from whom all blessing flow. Praise Him all creatures here below. Praise Him above ye heavenly hosts. Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost." Look around you this week as you prepare for the holiday of Thanksgiving. Let us follow the suggestion of the hymn writer who reminded us, to count our many blessings, and to name them one by one. We have been given many gifts, we however ask for one more, a grateful heart.
