Heritage Stained Glass Window Trivia: The 1901 building has 68 stained glass windows. Congratulations to Sonia Frazier, who guessed 67. Eleven of the memorial windows can be seen from the sanctuary. The other was placed in the basement's "ladies parlor," now the hand bell room. It is decorated with a sheaf of wheat. In 1901 the average cost per memorial window was \$98.58. The other 56 windows are less decorative and cost an average of \$7.86 per window. Almost all windows, even the memorials, have a sash or hinged section so they can be opened. Sonia receives a copy of the 2012 CWF cookbook.


