When replacing Christmas lights consider buying the LED strands.



This Sunday will be our third Sunday of Advent, the sermon will be entitled, "It's a Wonderful Life...The Gift of Joy." This Sunday's scripture lessons will be Isaiah 35: 1-10 and Matthew 11: 2-11.
