
Once again, we are accepting strands of Christmas lights for recycling. The collection bin is in the Communion Preparation Room.

Minister's Message:

When it comes to Christmas pageants, shepherds rank low on the list of desirable parts. The most coveted parts of course are Mary and Joseph, followed by the angels, and of course the wise men. Wearing those fancy robes and bringing gifts to the Christ child gives one a great degree of attention. If you are a shepherd in a church nativity scene, you get to wear a bathrobe and blankets over your head. You do not get to wear wings or crowns like the angels. While the angels are coming in from the heavens, shepherds hang out in the hills with the sheep and the dogs. That does not seem to be too important, except the gospel writer Luke thinks that it is.

We will examine Luke's passage 2: 1-20 as our sermon will be entitled, "The Angel's Message to the Shepherds." Shepherds in the time of the birth of Christ were not looked upon very favorably. They were rough kinds of people and were not quite looked upon as upper class. From the world of Charlie Brown, Pigpen would have been an excellent shepherd although Lucy gives him the role of Innkeeper. Of course, Linus already has a blanket to throw over his head. The angel's message came to ordinary people, individuals like us. It was then they had to make a choice as to what they were going to do. Would they leave immediately for Bethlehem? Who was going to take care of their sheep, their life's security? How did they know that the message of the heavenly hosts was reputable? They could have ignored the message, but did as they responded and became some of the world's first evangelists. They shared the story about the Christ child. What will we do about the message that comes to us? Will we wait for a convenient season? Let us go at once and travel to Bethlehem. See you on Sunday morning. I also hope to see you on the evening of our Christmas Candlelight Service and Christmas Day as well. We will have Sunday School and church on that date the same time as we always do. Slow down this week and maybe hear the message that is being sent to you.Larry
